

Univ.-Prof. Dr. Maximilian Moser, Ph.D.

- Profession: Professor of Physiology, Scientist
- Specialization: Chronobiology, Preventive Medicine
- Institution: Medical University of Graz, Human Research Institute in Weiz

Prof. Dr. Maximilian Moser is an internationally recognized expert in chronobiology, preventive medicine, and physiology. Born in 1956 in Klagenfurt, he has dedicated his career to exploring biological rhythms and their impact on human health. After studying biology and medicine at the Medical University of Graz, he founded the Human Research Institute in Weiz, which he continues to lead. His work focuses on innovations in health measurement and promotion.

Prof. Moser is the author and co-author of dozens of scientific publications in prestigious journals such as The Lancet, Circulation, Nature Communications, and Science. His research includes groundbreaking technologies such as ChronoCardiogram and ChronoCord, applied in preventive medicine, rehabilitation, and oncology. His contributions have

garnered interdisciplinary recognition and advanced the practical use of chronobiology to enhance quality of life. He continues to develop new approaches to health measurement and promotion based on biological rhythms, earning him the prestigious Science2Business Award.

A significant aspect of his research involved work on the MIR space station, where he contributed to monitoring the health of astronauts. He is also the co-author of the only German-language textbook on Chronobiology and Chronomedicine, which has been translated into several languages and serves as a foundation for the modern understanding of the relationship between biological rhythms and health.

In addition to his scientific and academic achievements, Prof. Moser is dedicated to promoting health in workplaces and schools, with his programs demonstrably improving the physical and mental well-being of participants.

Thanks to his groundbreaking approaches, he remains an inspirational figure in both scientific and practical health innovation.

Symposium Presentation

At the symposium, he will present his topic, "Health on the Wings of the Heart – Biological Rhythms in Measuring and Shaping Health," focusing on the importance of biological rhythms for human health. He compares the "temporal organism"—an invisible structure of health—with the anatomical "spatial organism," emphasizing that health disturbances can be detected through biological rhythms earlier than with conventional imaging methods.

Prof. Moser will also demonstrate how heart rhythms resonate with the rhythms of other organs and how heart rhythm flexibility reflects a person's vitality. The fascinating "music of the heart," which synchronizes with other bodily rhythms during sleep, is key to health regeneration and overall well-being. Using examples from his research, he will illustrate how chronobiology can be applied in practical health education and prevention.

Dr. med. Oliver M. Czech is a recognized expert in psychiatry, psychotherapy, psychosomatic medicine, and neurology. As the head physician of Friedrich-Husemann-Klinik in Buchenbach (a specialized clinic for psychiatry and psychotherapy and a teaching hospital of the University of Witten/Herdecke), he brings innovative approaches to clinical care, research, and education. His extensive experience and academic activities focus on integrating traditional medical disciplines with anthroposophic medicine, enabling him to bring new perspectives to patient care and research.

Born in 1967 in Hanover, Dr. Czech has combined his deep interest in science with a holistic view of the human being throughout his professional career. During his civilian alternate service at the renowned Filderklinik in Filderstadt, he became acquainted with anthroposophic approaches to medicine, which significantly influenced his career path. He studied medicine at Freie Universität Berlin and earned his doctorate at Charité Universitätsmedizin Berlin. He further specialized in neurology, psychiatry, and psychosomatic medicine, training at prestigious institutions such as RWTH Aachen University Hospital and Bürgerhospital Stuttgart.

In addition to his clinical practice, Dr. Czech is an esteemed educator and researcher. He lectures at universities, publishes scientific papers, actively contributes to clinical supervision and has published a book chapter about neurophysiological diagnostics. By combining scientific knowledge with the spiritual dimension of the human being, he explores questions of physical and mental balance from a unique perspective.

Dr. Oliver M. Czech is an expert who bridges science, clinical practice and philosophical questions of human existence, and his approach inspires not only the professional community but also those seeking a deeper understanding of human nature.

Symposium Presentation

At the symposium, Dr. Czech will present a topic focusing on a comprehensive understanding of the human nervous system. In his presentation, "Das menschliche Nervensystem: Polarität und Bewusstsein" ("The Human Nervous System: Polarity and Consciousness"), he will explore the neurophysiological and spiritual-philosophical aspects of the polarity between the somatic and vegetative functions of the nervous system. Dr. Czech highlights the ongoing epistemological gap between objective and subjective sensory physiology and challenges the cerebrocentric view, which reduces mental and spiritual experiences solely to brain functions.

In his presentation, he will offer insights into modern psychosomatics and psychotherapeutic concepts and connect them with Rudolf Steiner's key ideas on the spiritual essence of the human being. These approaches can contribute to overcoming the dualistic perception of body and soul and to creating a more integrated understanding of the human being.

- **Specialization:** Research teaching public relations / project development, implementation, and international practice of anthroposophic body therapies, auditor, supervisor, quality management.

Charlotte Allmer expanded her therapeutic knowledge after completing her diploma studies in Biodynamic Psychology and Body Psychotherapy in London with further training in various body therapies across the EU. To support the recognition of unknown but highly effective methods within the EU. she successfully completed an EU master's and doctoral program in complementary, integrative, and psychosocial health sciences, as well as a master's degree in education. These studies were accompanied by corresponding theses and publications on disease patterns and evaluation tools in the Merkurstab journal. During this phase, her film on the Rhythmic

Massage Method according to Dr. Ita Wegman – "The Peripheral Heart" was also created.

Since then, her work in research, teaching, and public engagement has been fundamentally rooted in the practical implementation of various projects that she establishes across Europe. With the symposium in June 2025 in Prague, a seven-year project focusing on "External Applications and Psychosocial Health Development" will come to its conclusion. This project trained and further educated healthcare professionals from nursing, therapy, and medicine to become therapists and instructors in Rhythmical Massage and Rhythmical Movement Baths according to Dr. Ita Wegman.

Throughout her extensive clinical practice and private practice work, Charlotte Allmer has developed tools for interdisciplinary teams. The focus here is on patient-centered work in the clinical-therapeutic field.

As an IKAM auditor, mentor, and supervisor, she is particularly committed to quality development based on practice-oriented theory.

With the founding of the "Ita Wegman Academy Styria Development Association", Charlotte Allmer is setting new standards in research,

teaching, and public engagement for modern adult education, evaluation tools, and patient-centered clinicaltherapeutic work. The association is in active international exchange with universities, academies, the IFRMT, and the Medical Section of Anthroposophic Medicine.

Symposium Presentation

At the symposium, Charlotte Allmer will present a lecture titled "Rhythmological Synopsis in Theory and Application". Since there are few or no quality assurance instruments for clinical-therapeutic interventions with longitudinal data collection and process representation, this presentation aims to help bridge that gap. By evaluating a "companion questionnaire, application observation/ process documentation", a synoptic representation of, for example, build-up and breakdown processes - anabolically-catabolically living organisms in correlation with HRV will be obtained.
